Notes and corrections

- 1 The *Hotel California* referred to is the album. The single of the same name was released in 1977.
- ² Hereford and Durham cathedrals also have copies of *Magna Carta*, but these are of later (i.e. post-1215) versions of the text.
- 3 There are umpteen different versions of this song and they mostly agree up to eight, but

thereafter anything goes. 'Ladies dancing' is most commonly used for nine, but there are versions that refer to nine 'lords-a-leaping', 'drummers drumming', 'pipers piping/playing' and even 'ladies waiting'.

4 Whilst 'Abdullah' is correct, it is only one of dozens of Arabic names that mean 'servant of God/Allah'.

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
